

HRM Task Force Updates



The OMD HRM Task Force brought together key system partners and decision makers (Ontario Health, hospitals, EMR vendors, HIS vendors, OMA, OHA) to find solutions to the pain points of HRM.

The Task Force has concluded after one year and recommendations are pending.

As mentioned previously, the Task Force has supported the creation of four key documents: **Current State Assessment, Sending Facility Service Standards, EMR Usability Recommendations** and a **proposed Execution Plan**.

Digital Health Tools

EMR Searches for Biosimilars

OMD has developed new EMR queries for Accuro® EMR, OSCAR Pro, and TELUS PSS for you to identify patients who have been prescribed products affected by the Ministry's new biosimilars policy.

Easily download, import and run these queries to produce a report and check whether these patients have one or more biologics that are currently covered by the Ontario Drug Benefit (ODB) program. To check this, for those connected to the provincial Digital Health



Drug Repository, you can access the DHDR from an EMR. Alternatively, you can manually cross-check the patient list generated by the query with DHDR via the Connecting Ontario portal. <u>Learn more and access the EMR queries</u>.

Reminder: Updated Diabetes Outpatient Care Flow Sheet



In case you missed it, the <u>Canadian Cardiovascular Harmonized National Guidelines Endeavour</u> (C-CHANGE), updated the <u>Diabetes Outpatient Care Flow Sheet</u> for clinicians in collaboration with Diabetes Canada. This flow sheet aligns with leading practices and includes the existing billing incentive for primary care. The information is evidence-based and published in the clinical practice guidelines from Diabetes Canada and C-CHANGE. It is currently integrated with Accuro® EMR. If you use another certified EMR, please ask your EMR vendor about accessing the updated flow sheet.

Important Reminders

Are You Moving? HRM Needs to Know Where You Are!

Just like the post office, HRM needs to know where to deliver your reports. Moving? Switching Internet providers? Changing your Internet plan? Choosing a new EMR? These scenarios could potentially mean a change to your IP delivery address, disrupting your HRM feed and stopping your reports from sending sites. HRM only delivers to locations it trusts, so **don't forget to notify OMD** at support@ontariomd.com when making a change. We need a minimum of 7 business days from the time we receive your complete request with a valid IP address to ensure you don't experience any service interruptions.
