Category: Medication Management/Psychoactive

Purpose:

This indicator is used to identify patients prescribed an antipsychotic medication.

Source:

Based on Health Data Coalition Current Clinical Measures, June 2018.

Base Population:

All patients with an Active demographic status recorded in the EMR.

Indicator Segments:

<u>Currently prescribed:</u> Count of patients WITH at least one current antipsychotic prescription documented.

<u>Only past prescriptions:</u> Count of patients WITHOUT ANY current antipsychotic prescriptions documented AND WITH at least one past antipsychotic prescription documented.

<u>Never Prescribed:</u> Count of patients WITHOUT ANY current or past antipsychotic prescriptions documented.

Current antipsychotic prescription is any of the following medications (generic names listed) that are current (not discontinued) medications:

'lurasidone'	'olanzapine'	'paliperidone'	'quetiapine'

Past antipsychotic prescription is any of the above medications that are past (discontinued) medications.

Suggested Indicator Use:

Physician or Practice use of this indicator is to identify or recall patients who are currently prescribed antipsychotic medications.
